



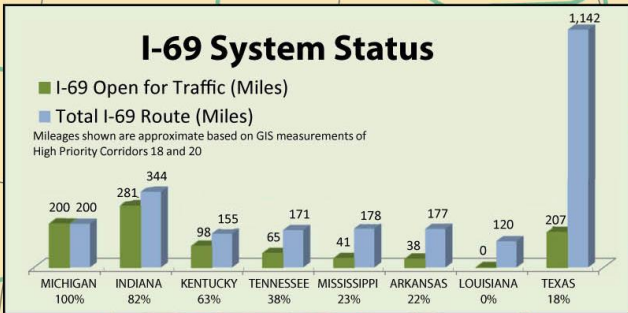

Port Huron & Detroit Account for 40% of All U.S. Northern Border Truck Crossings (US DOT Data)



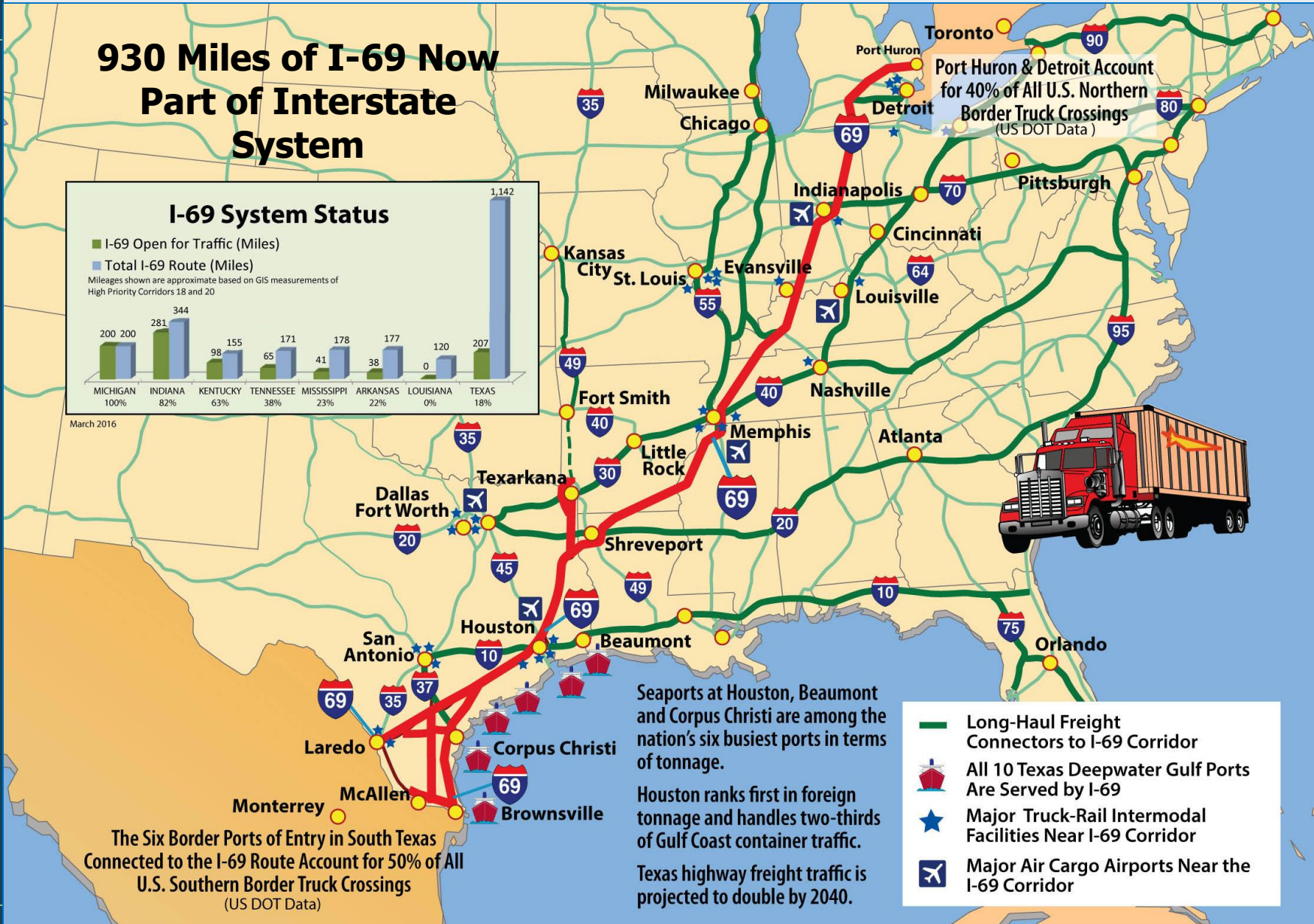

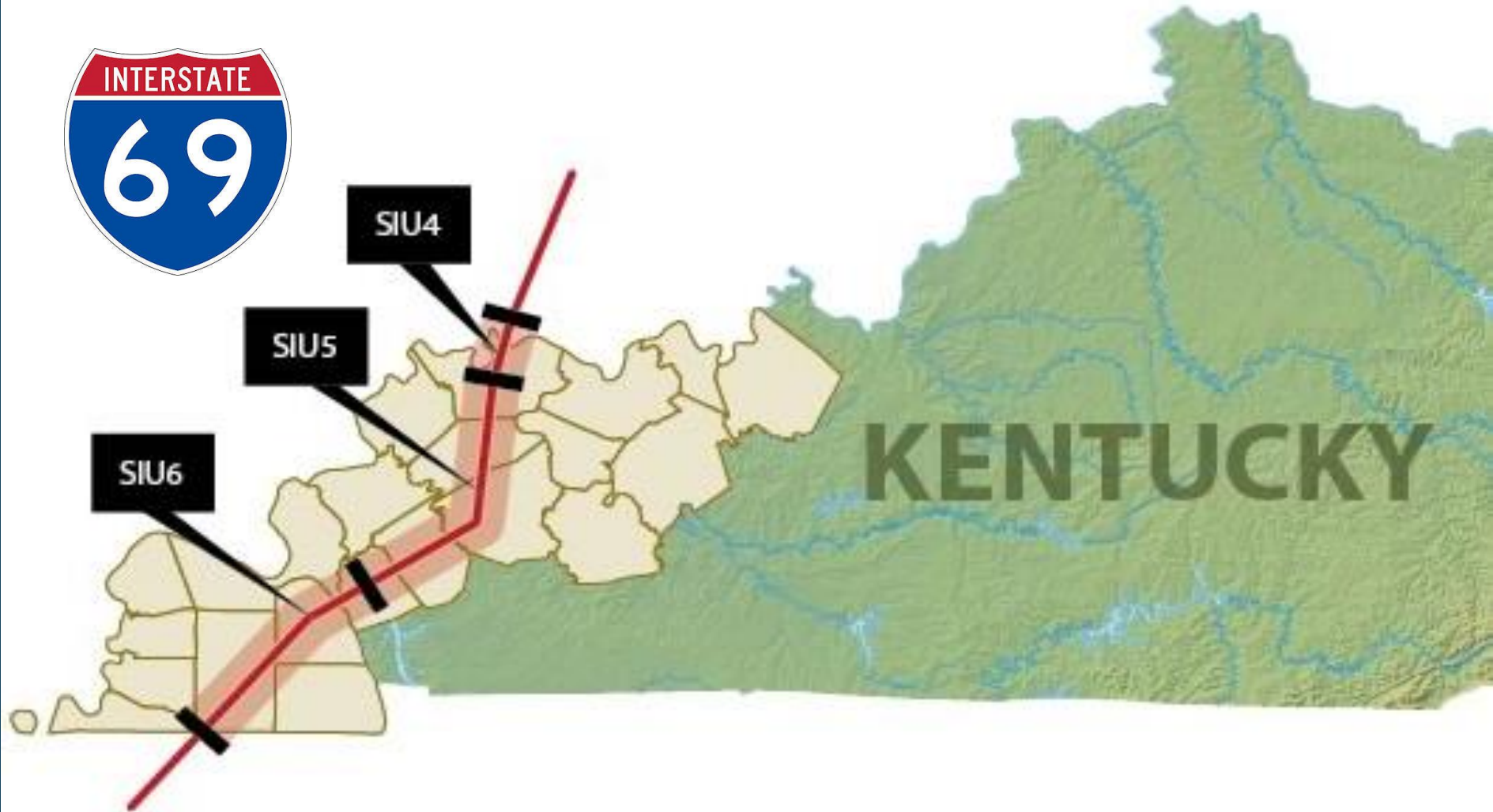

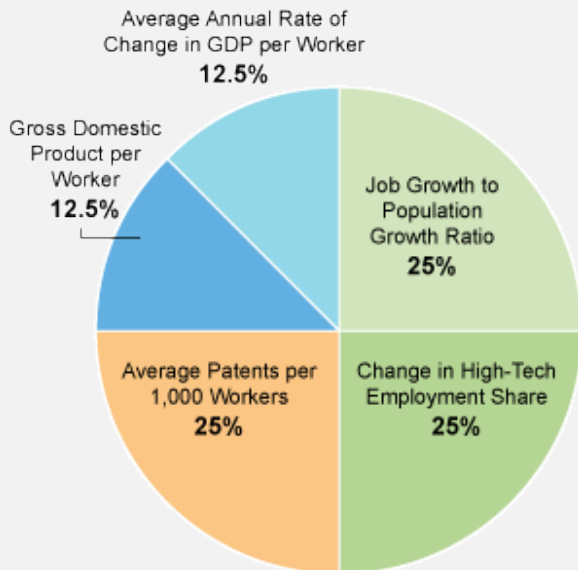


Economic Dynamics: 30%

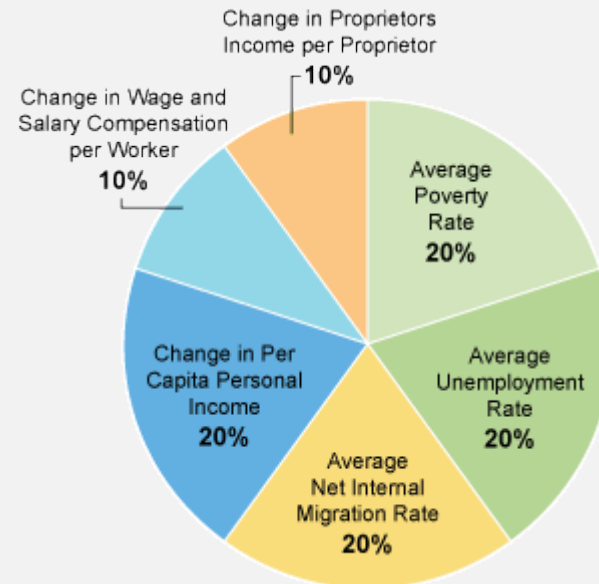

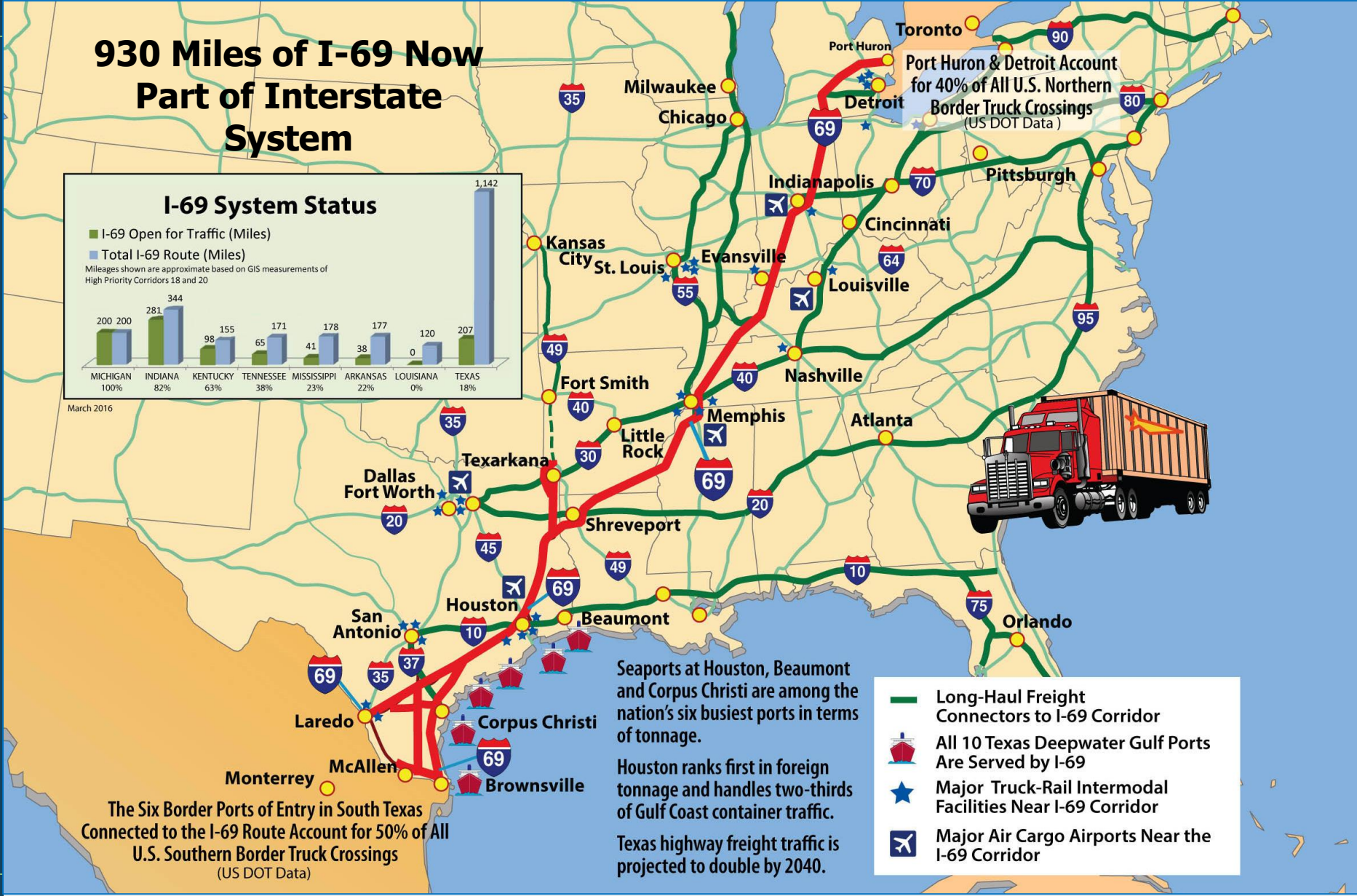
