New Highway Bill Means More I-69 Signs



- Federal highway bill removes requirement that completed segments be connected to existing interstate
- Now segments can be added to Interstate Highway System and signed as soon as FHWA determines they are at interstate standard
- This was a major I-69 Alliance initiative

- 35 miles of Eastex added to I-69 in Texas – North Loop 610 to Liberty County
- Next segment will be South Loop 610 to Rosenberg
- Several more sections likely to be added to Interstate System during 2013

I-69 Is One Reason Texas is Ranked #1


- Texas named No. 1 place to do business by CNBC

- I-69 serves as a critical connector to and from Texas deepwater ports



Interstate 69 in Montgomery County


Feds Approve FONSI for US 77 Upgrade

- Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) covers entire length from Corpus Christi to Harlingen
- Provides blanket environmental clearance for upgrade projects
- Will link Rio Grande Valley to national Interstate System
- Two major projects in Nueces
 County will be among the first
 to use this clearance



Funded Projects On I-69 Routes

- 37 projects identified by TxDOT with an estimated cost of \$637 Million
- I-69 route projects are on US 59, US 84, US 77, US 281 and Loop 20 at Laredo



I-69 Advisory Committee Final Report

- To be presented to Transportation Commission on Dec. 13th
- Will pull together the work and priority recommendations of five local citizen Segment Committees

Reliable Highway Funding

- Alliance for I-69 is partnering with Transportation Advocates of Texas
- We are endorsing Chairman Nichols bill to dedicate vehicle sales tax revenues to highway funding
- Other Funding Objectives:
 - Use transportation revenues to fund transportation
 - Authorize CDA funding for additional projects nominated by local elected officials and MPOs
 - Increase the vehicle registration fees
 - Capitalize the Rail Relocation and Improvement Fund
